McCormick Deering "B" tractor. As a new VITEO venture, the exact toy model was sold at the 2016 Ottawa Valley Farm Show.

The 1940 Farmall "B" was built from 1939 until 1946. It was sold with no battery, lights, starter, etc., only a crank. When discontinued it was replaced with the Farmall "C" model.

In the late 1970, Keith purchased a 1924 McCormick Deering 10-20 tractor and restored it to its full glory. In 1980, to his amazement, he was able to purchase his father's 1951 McCormick Deering W-4, purchased new by his dad from a local Russell Dealership.

Following retirement in 1995, for the next twelve years, Keith and his wife travelled throughout the country until his wife passed away in 2007 with cancer. With the help from his son Brent and cousin Bryan the hobby of tractor restoration totalled eight tractors with the final one shown in the above picture.

ALLIS-CHALMERS D-14 NEXT YEAR'S FARM SHOW MODEL



Following its successful first model tractor sale at the 2016 Ottawa Valley Farm Show, VITEO will repeat the event in 2017, once again helping the Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario with part of the proceeds.

Last year, the tractor selected was a Farmall 460, with 50 models selling out in under an hour. Number One in the series went into the annual auction, raising \$4,000 for CHEO. Next year, the Farm Show tractor will be an Allis-Chalmers D-14, with 125 models available at \$75 each.

Visitors to the museum, who took in the show, are realizing that VITEO and similar organizations deserve a lot of credit for the restoration and preservation work they do in the name of comradery and a common interest.

It's largely thanks to these passionate volunteers that much of Ontario's rural heritage is maintained for posterity at no cost to the general public.

About fifty club members turned out to enjoy barbecued burgers, hot dogs and beverages, along with salads, desserts and other dishes provided by members and guests.

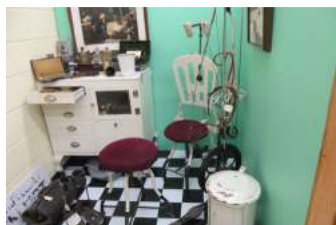

Since 1973, the Osgoode Township Museum has been located in the former village public school. The agricultural artifact building where VITEO members gathered, opened in 1989.

Between the two buildings, some 10,000 items are housed, from full-sized tractors and other machinery, to housewares and historic documents.
