The first parade is for Glen Armstrong. It will muster at Bearbrook Community Centre June 19, 10 a.m., and will cover about three km there and back to the Armstrong family farm; the second parade will be out of Carp July 25 starting at 1 p.m. in honour of Dave Creighton and will be 10 km from start to finish; the third parade, 10 a.m., Aug. 14 is a repeat of one held last year from St. Albert to Crysler and back.

A veteran VITEO member is coordinating each parade: Past President Hank Bakker at Bearbrook; Past President Barry Dean at Carp; and myself, current President, at St. Albert. He and Hank were lifelong friends involved in many committees and projects together; the procession will pull into the Armstrong farmyard and pass in front of family members, with an urn containing Glen's ashes resting on a parked tractor seat. Our secretary, Sharen, was at the meeting at Staal's; she thanked the club for the gesture of respect for her younger brother and indicated full family support for the parade.
